Who are IoD Ambassadors?

IoD Ambassadors are key people within the IoD Regions, Nations and Branches, playing a vital role in the function of the IoD. They provide local connectivity with IoD Members and give a local 'voice' and presence to the Institute. They are the means by which IoD national policy is reflective of local issues and can be contextualised locally.

IoD Ambassadors form the Branch leadership teams, led by their Region, Nation or Branch Chair. They have a vital role to play in the development of the IoD. Their activities have a significant influence, not just on the membership but on the stature, image and reputation of the Institute.

IoD Ambassadors encourage members to engage with their IoD and facilitate connection to other members. Ambassadors are tune into local and regional issues. They contribute to a programme of relevant and engaging events to inspire members.

They are also the means by which IoD national policy is reflected locally. IoD Ambassadors and their Chairmen, therefore, have an important role to play in the development of the IoD.

Their activities have a significant influence not just on the membership but on the stature, image and reputation of the Institute.

IoD Ambassadors across the UK, and in Europe, work with us to ensure that members are engaged with their IoD and connected to each other; they are tapped into local and regional issues, and contribute to a programme of relevant, interesting and engaging events and activity to inspire members.

As an IoD Ambassador you will champion the highest standards as set out in the IoD Competency Framework

Key behaviours across all roles (Volunteer & Staff)

Regions/Nations behaviours, desired in our Community and our Staffed teams - linked to our Vision/Values and the Director Competency Framework (see appendix F)

- Brings ideas whilst accepting perspectives and ideas different to their own;
- Champions IoD ambition regarding diversity and inclusivity;
- Is highly regarded and respected by their peers;
- Is a good listener and communicator, while demonstrating strong commitment to developing great leaders across our regions, nations and branches;
- Devotes time and effort to Leadership Group activities, and supports the Regional Director and wider executive team;
- Seeks to realise the potential energy of the Leadership Group;
- Declares any interests, prevents any personal or business interest from conflicting with this role on the Leadership Group, and avoids using this position directly to promote personal interests;
- Supports the national standards, policies and priorities of the IoD;
- Acts in a professional, courteous manner towards Members, IoD Staff, Ambassadors and local contacts.

Geographic focus

There could be up to 12 Ambassadors, appointed to form a Branch leadership team. Each Ambassador will have a clear and defined role that aligns to locally decided priorities. Where appropriate, Ambassadors may take the lead in more than one priority.

IoD purpose, vision and values

The IoD is the UK's longest-running organisation for professional leaders. Our mission is 'to support our members, encourage entrepreneurial activity, and promote responsible business practice for the benefit of the business community and society as a whole'.

This means that the IoD strives to make our country's leaders (in enterprise, public sector and non-profits) the very best that they can be. We recognise that, with the best leadership and corporate governance, profitable businesses and sustainable organisations can be a positive force in our communities and society - creating quality jobs, driving prosperity, and making our regions and nations better places to live and work.

4) Policy, representation and campaigning

Representing our places and sectors, we influence at the very heart of national and regional government, bringing our members' voices directly to policy-makers.

We also recognise that many of our members lead SMEs, and do not have Policy or Campaigning teams, so we strive to educate and inform around key topics with a view to driving a collective understanding and mutual ambition around great leadership, governance and high quality sustainable business.


